

## Uniform

Navy blue blazer with school badge.

House tie.

Black trousers or skirt (girls)\*

Plain white cotton shirt of a conventional style that must have a top button that fastens and be of a length that it can be tucked in.

Navy school jumper, cardigan or tank top with the school badge (optional.)

Plain black, white or tan short socks or tights

Plain black shoes with low heels of a material that can be polished.\*

### Physical Education (for both boys and girls):

Plain navy shorts (boys) or skirt (girls)

Predominantly white trainers with a good supporting sole.

White short socks.

Navy and red school short-sleeved PE polo top (with school logo).

Navy football socks (for hockey, rugby, football and orienteering)

Navy tracksuit bottoms\*

Plain colour swimsuit (boys: trunks/shorts - not Bermuda style shorts. Girls: one piece)

Shin pads

#### **Additional PE items:**

Reversible navy and red school training top (boys)

Football boots (check website for timetabling details of football and rugby)

Mouthguard

Navy school hoody with school logo (optional)

Junior Sports Leaders will have title embroidered over crest on polo top.

### Design Technology:

A simple 'bib' type apron in strong fabric.

### Jewellery:

Jewellery is NOT allowed except for one small plain ring and one pair of small plain studs in pierced ears – but studs are to be removed for PE.

**No nose, eyebrow, lip, tongue or other body piercing, studs, rings, spacers, or flesh tunnels are allowed. We strongly advise against such piercings, and they must be removed in school.**

Tattoos are also inappropriate and must not be visible.

Badges, unless associated with school activities, are not allowed.

### Hair and Make-Up:

Hair should be a natural colour and worn in a simple, inconspicuous style.

Any obvious artificial colouring or unorthodox styles (including graded patterns) are not acceptable.

The wearing of make-up is discouraged, and those wearing excessive make up will be asked to remove it. Nail varnish and/or acrylic coloured nails are not permitted.

### Outdoor clothing:

Coats should be largely single coloured, plain and not feature dominant or excessive patterns or logos. A school hoody may be worn in place of a coat in dry weather and should therefore be worn over the blazer.

During the winter months coats may be worn from lesson to lesson but must be removed on reaching the classroom. Scarves, hats, and gloves may be a sensible addition during cold weather but should accompany a coat and also be removed on reaching the classroom.

### Summer Uniform

Summer uniform is worn at a point, communicated to students, following the Mayday Bank Holiday until the end of the academic year in July. During this time blazers and jumpers are optional but if it is cold enough for a coat then they should be worn as per winter uniform. Ties and top buttons remain done up correctly unless directed otherwise by the Headteacher during excessive hot weather.

### \*Additional guidance:

Trousers – must be a school type trouser, with straight legs, neither too low on the hips or an excessively skinny or baggy fit.

The school tie must be tied correctly and the top button of the shirt fastened.

School skirts must be knee length or 20" long and not made from a clingy Lycra style fabric that is likely to ride up.

Examples of appropriate skirts, trousers, jewellery and coats are displayed on the website.

School jumper, cardigan or tank-top can be purchased direct from the suppliers.

Shoes should **not be** boots or trainers, or have coloured stripes or logos.

Tracksuit bottoms must be navy in colour and neither flared or 3/4 length - examples are displayed on the website.

**NB** – All items of clothing must be clearly marked with the owner's name.

### Please note:

Pupils not wearing correct uniform will be given a uniform detention and may be internally excluded or sent home.
